Dear Mr. Olawski:

In response to your letter of October 27, 2008, addressed to Mr. Cholish, property owner, I wish to offer the following.

The accompanying drawing has been revised to November 19, 2008. The revisions address the change in wording requested in your first outstanding issue. Two additional photo locations are also shown on the drawing, as well as a collection of gathered stones.

The additional area of disturbance you observed on an aerial photograph are two sections of loose stone wall, total length approximately 25 feet by 2 ½ feet wide and 2 ½ feet high. They are on Lot 29, Block 6900, and have been in this location for at least 20 years. The stones were apparently left when the adjoining residence was constructed. The adjoining resident apparently cleared his property by placing them on Mr. Cholish's site. The age of the wall is approximate, but the patina of the stones suggests its age. The stones did not show up on earlier surveys, as they are no along the property line and do not denote a boundary. These comments relate to the second issue raised in your correspondence.

Also enclosed herewith are two photographs of the property showing the loose stones.

Copies of this letter and attachments have been sent to the Highlands Commission and the Clerk of the municipality, with the cover letter only being sent to all other interested parties.
