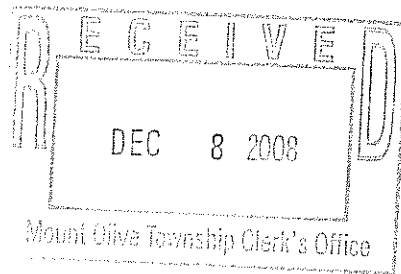

Dear Ms. Lashway:

The New Jersey Worker and Community Right To Know Law requires a complete inventory of all hazardous products in your building(s) every five years. We are coming up to the "fifth" year requirement this year. In other words, the 2008 Right To Know survey filed by July 15, 2009 must include a complete inventory of all hazardous products in your facilities.

In addition to maintaining Material Safety Data Sheets in every building that match the physical inventory, municipal facilities are also required to have the current Hazardous Substance Fact Sheets (Fact Sheets) on file. Since the Listing of Hazardous Substances changed in January 2008, many of your Fact Sheets may be outdated, while many others may have to be included.

Under the PEOSH Hazard Communications Standard, training of your employees continues to be a requirement.
