Recovery and Reinvestment Act-Recovery Zone Bonds

Edward McManimon, Esq., McManimon & Scotland LLC, will provide an overview of the **Recovery Zone Economic Development Bonds** funding for capital expenditures within a recovery zone property project including public infrastructure, the construction of public facilities, education and job training. Further, he will discuss **Recovery Zone Facility Bonds** which were developed to fund private commercial properties that were purchased, constructed, renovated or reconstructed for use by qualified non-residential businesses in a previously designated recovery zone.

The New Jersey Environmental Infrastructure Trust (NJEIT)

Maryclaire D'Andrea, Acting Executive Director, NJEIT, will provide an overview of the NJEIT and discuss the low-cost financing available for the construction of environmental infrastructure projects that enhance and protect ground and

surface water resources, ensure the safety of drinking water supplies, and make possible responsible and sustainable economic development.

New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA)

Caren Franzini, CEO, NJEDA will provide an overview of the financing and incentive programs of the NJEDA highlighting the Urban Transit Hub Tax Credit Program, Bond Financing Business Retention and Relocation Assistant Grant Program and Bond Financing.
