Dear Local Official,

The National Park Service (NPS) has suggested multiple alternate routes for the Susquehanna Roseland line. A list of potentially impacted new towns is contained below. Note that several towns would be impacted by more than one alternative route.

PSE&G must evaluate these alternatives and fully participate in the process established by the NPS. Meantime, the existing route proposed by PSE&G has gone through extensive regulatory review, and we believe it to be the best one possible.

The 'Preliminary Alternatives Newsletter' is posted on the National Park Service park planning site for Susquehanna-Roseland. 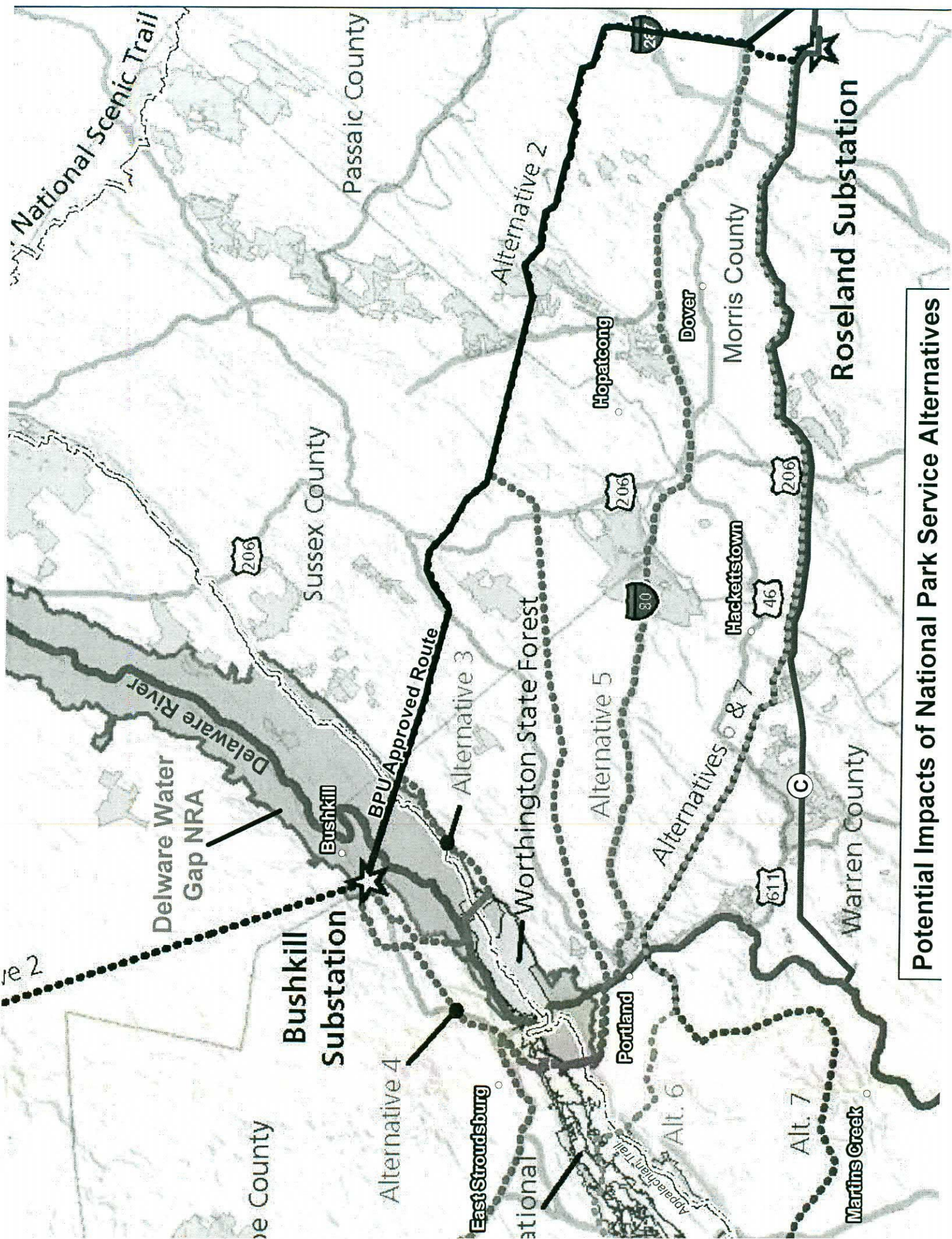
